WHAT IS MASS?

Postures-Standing

The liturgy is meant to engage the whole person. Our posture then is a means a prayer and a means to foster unity within the community (we all sit, stand, and kneel at the same time). We stand for the Introductory Rites, the Gospel procession and proclamation, the Creed, the Prayer of the Faithful, the preparation of the gifts, the parts of the Eucharistic Prayer that are not consecration, and the Prayer after Communion. Standing is a way we show reverence and thanksgiving which is why we stand for the Gospel and the Eucharistic Prayer (in parts). It is also a posture of offering, which is why we stand for the presentation of the gifts. Most importantly perhaps it is also a posture of openness to Jesus and to the community.

"Whoever wishes to great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be slave of all." —Mark 10:43-44

In our world today, we often want to get good grades, be great at sports, be known as a good artist or musician, etc. In contrast, Jesus wasn't considered successful or accomplished. He grew up in a very small town as the son of a simple carpenter—which wasn't a very respected job. Jesus was looked down upon because of where he was from, he wasn't always admired, and he was constantly questioned. Yet he taught that it is better to be last than to be first, and to be a servant than to be the one who is served. It may not be easy to follow that example, but our faith calls us to live our lives for others as Jesus did.

Dear Lord, we are sorry for the times when we try to be better than those around us. Please help us to be less concerned with ourselves, and learn to put others' needs before our own.

REFLECTION OF STEWARDSHIP

As Christians who are called to imitate Christ, we may sometimes feel that Jesus, being God, doesn't know what it's like to struggle here on earth. However, St. Paul says "we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin." Therefore, when we face trials in our stewardship, let us turn to Jesus and ask Him to help us overcome our struggles just as He did during His time on earth.
